
## **Conflict: Terminology**

- Conflict: From L. conflictus, pp. of confligere "to strike together," from con- "together" + fligere "to strike"
- The Arabic equivalent of **conflict** is not **niza'** (نناع) or **tanaazu'** (ننازع) but:
- Tadharub from from "ta" (together) + "dharub"
   (to strike) ت + ضارب = تضارب


## **Conflict: Definition in conflictology**


Daynamic relation between two or more parties (indivuduals, groups, states, civilizations) with (apparently) contradictory goals (positions, interests, needs, values).


